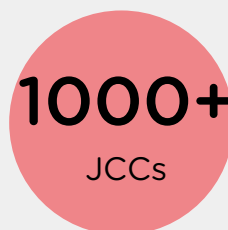

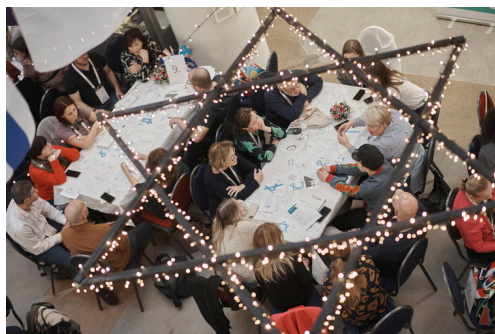


Creating Partnerships Around the World

The program was launched at the JCC Global conference in Budapest, bringing together more than 100 participants from 10 countries - Argentina, Hungary, Israel, Italy, Mexico, Poland, Serbia, Ukraine, UK and USA.

A Celebration of Culture and Connection: A global project for 36 women from Hesed Nefesh, Poltava, Ukraine; Hesed Haim Sumy, Ukraine, and the Pardesia Community Center, Israel. Local in-person meetings and joint online sessions featured dance, Yiddish songs and Jewish cuisine. The journey will continue in October at a joint one week in-person seminar in Krakow, Poland.



JCC Global - Teens Connect

A global project of Beit Grand JCC, Odesa, Ukraine; Shimon and Sara Birnbaum JCC, Bridgewater, New Jersey and Migvanim, Ramat Hasharon, Israel. Thanks to the warm invitation of the Bridgeater JCC, teens from Odesa and Ramat Hasharon flew to New Jersey in July where they joined the camp team as junior instructors for two weeks and were hosted by local families.

A global project of JCC Solomonika, Dnipro, Ukraine; Edith and Carl Marks JCH of Bensonhurst, New York, USA and Krakow JCC, Poland. An innovative international tutoring initiative whereby young adults from NY and Krakow tutor children in Dnipro- creating not just academic progress, but meaningful cross-border connections.

A global project of Hesed Hana, Kryvyi Rih, Ukraine; Mandel JCC Palm Beach Gardens, Palm Beach Gardens, FL, USA and JCC Budapest Bálint Ház, Budapest, Hungary. While the filming of Holocaust survivors by local teens is still being developed, in-person delegations visited Budapest: In the spring teens from Kryvyi Rih and in July teens from West Palm Beach.

SecondStride Employment Initiative



JCC Global's SecondStride initiative has successfully addressed Ukraine's wartime employment crisis through an innovative, network-based approach spanning eight JCCs nationwide. In its inaugural year, the program served 1041 individuals, with 226 people (21.7%) securing employment through full-time positions, part-time work, freelancing opportunities, or launching their own businesses. The program was made possible thanks to a grant from UJA Federation of New York.

Mental Health and Healing Programs



Thanks to a grant from the Jack Buncher Foundation, 10 JCCs across Ukraine and Moldova served more than 2,200 individuals. The grant provided psychological, social, and healing programs for displaced refugees from Ukraine and for individuals with special needs, with JCC Global serving as a facilitator and supervisor.

The Hub meets once a month online to enable peer support, enrichment, and ongoing guidance. This year the sessions focused, thus far, on strategic planning and board development. The program is implemented in partnership with JDC.

Helping Ukrainian Refugees



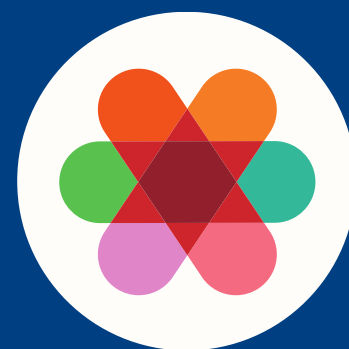
The war forced countless Ukrainians to leave their communities and seek safety across borders. Thanks to a grant from the Ronald S. Roadburg Foundation, JCC Budapest and JCC Krakow were able to provide community activities, summer camp events, mental health sessions and personalized support to hundreds of immigrants. The grant also expanded mental health support in Ukraine.



Supporting Jewish Life & Community

Da'at program for Jewish Educators in Former Yugoslavia communities

Now in its fifth year, this regional initiative led by JCC Global and Haver Srbija has entered a new phase. With support from [the Pincus Fund](#), the program is aimed at creating and leading values-based educational programs. It features a Dr. Mark Ramer Hub, a seminar in Slovenia and project implementation.

JCC Global continues to strengthen global Jewish connections by celebrating online holidays in creative, collaborative ways with hundreds of participants.

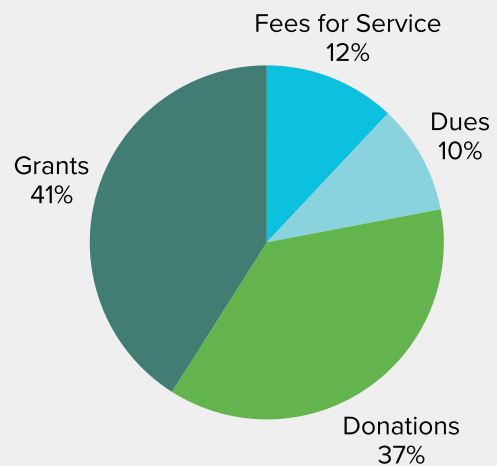




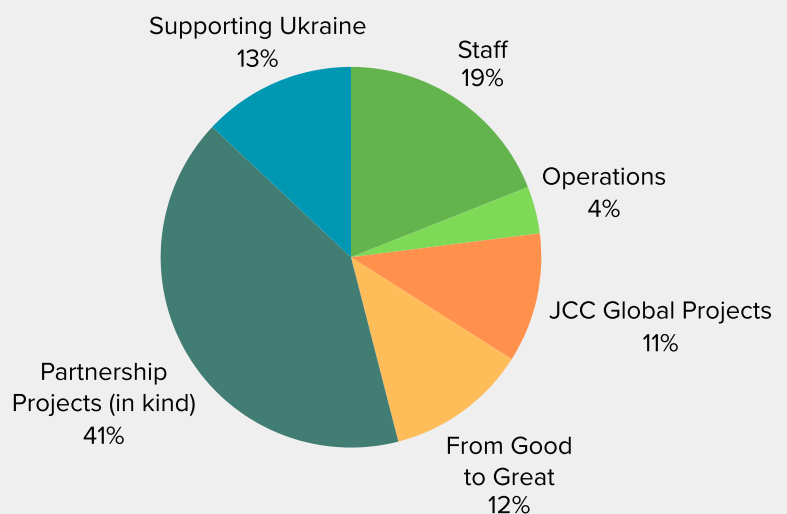
